

BCRI Visitor Policies

For a safe and pleasant experience at BCRI, please refrain from the following during your visit:

- Smoking
- Back Packs and large bags
- Soliciting
- Running, yelling and disruptive behavior
- Food, drinks and chewing gum

Safety guidelines

- Shirt and footwear are required for entry
- Children under the age of 12 must be accompanied by an adult at all time.
- Strollers are permitted in museum spaces; however, be aware that our spaces are limited in size.
- Cell Phones: In the interest of maintaining a pleasant environment for all of our guests, visitors are asked to place cell phones on silent mode or turn them off while in the galleries (unless for personal use of photography). If an important phone call is received, please leave the galleries to have your conversation
- Please do not touch or lean on the works of art, museum cases or pedestals.
- No pets will be allowed in the building, with the exception of guide dogs.

Accessibility

The Museum is fully accessible to all visitors. Special needs are met with designated parking spaces and a ground level entrance adjacent to the Museum parking lot. Ramps and elevators serve the entrance and lobby. A limited number of wheelchairs are available at the security station near the parking lot entrance. If you have any questions, please speak to the ticket booth.

Photography

Photography is allowed in the Museum galleries without flash for personal use only. Commercial use of still photography and videotaping are permitted with payment of \$200 an hour. Advance notice is required for all media, commercial, or video/film requests. Same day requests will not be considered or approved.
